Since our chapters re-chartering in 2018, Zeta Upsilon has upheld a proud tradition of leadership on the national stage. Among over 10,000 brothers nationwide, Zeta Upsilon brothers have consistently been selected to represent the collegiate voice on the High Council, Sigma Nu’s governing board. The High Council consists of the Regent, Regent-Elect, Grand Treasurer, and multiple Vice Regents.

This tradition began in 2021 with the appointment of Brother Dominic Frattura, followed by John Hopkins in 2022 and Andrew Kalthoff in 2023. While Zeta Upsilon did not have representation on the High Council in 2024, the chapter continued to demonstrate leadership excellence on the Foundation.

Brother Stegner Bell was honored by being selected for the collegiate position on the Sigma Nu National Educational Foundation that year.

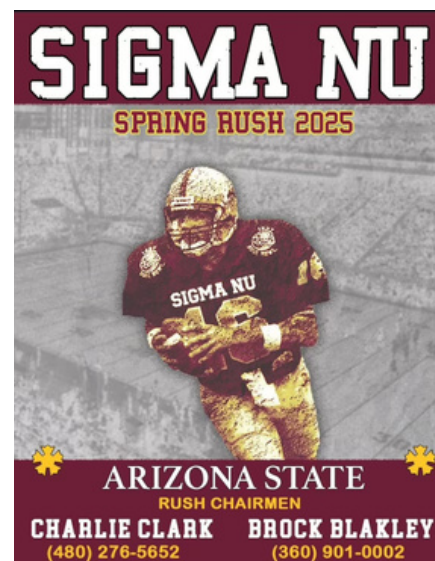

Seeking Sponsors for Relays



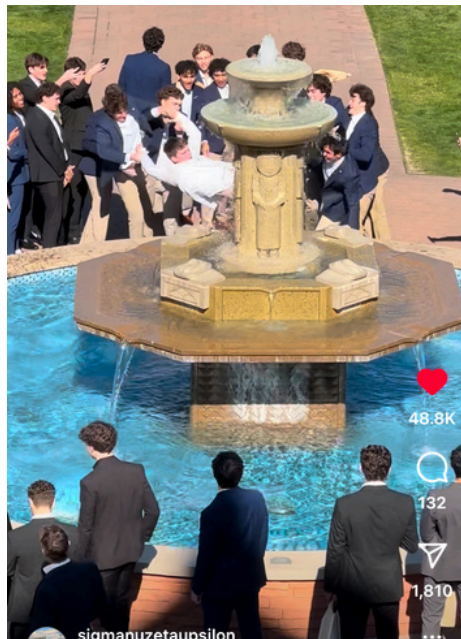

ZY Tradition Turns Into Viral Sensation



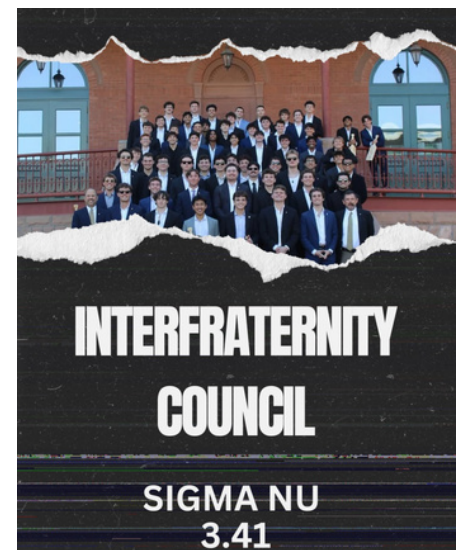

We've compiled excerpts from past ZY Commanders about how their time as Commander affected their lives.

Creighton Anderson

(ZY 825) Eminent Commander in 1988.

"Serving as the Eminent Commander of the Zeta Upsilon chapter is an honor I have cherished nearly 40 years. The opportunity to lead a group of sterling individuals at a time when Sigma Nu was well represented in student organizations, racking up intramural championships, serving the community with our philanthropic outreach and earning the coveted Rock Chapter award is a great sense of fulfillment. The responsibilities and challenges of being an Eminent Commander helped shape me and provide me with experiences and skills I use today. Above all else, I value the bonds I created with the Brothers and the

fond memories of being a Sun Devil Sigma Nu."

David Christian

(ZY 294) Eminent Commander, Spring, 1973.

"In the fall of 1969, I packed my car for a 1,050 mile car trip from Tulsa, Ok to ASU. My mom gave me a hug and a kiss, my dad shook my hand and then I was on the way to a school where I would not know a single soul.

I arrived in Tempe a day before the dorms opened so I stayed at the Holiday Inn near the airport. A young man was working the registration desk and asked me the nature of my business. I said I am checking into Sahuaro dorm tomorrow at ASU. He then asked if I was going through fraternity rush and I said I was. He said he was a member of Sigma Nu and the members were having a get together that night. He asked if I would like to come which I was ecstatic about doing so. I did not know it at the time but he was Mike Reed, ZY 262, the current EC and the first Sigma Nu I ever met.

The next day I checked into Sahuaro dorm. Due to the excess number of students, I was in a small room with two other students. Mike came by that day and asked if I wanted to look at the Sigma Nu house. When

he took me to the house, every member came up and introduced themselves to me. I was so impressed; I asked Mike if I could move in. We went back to Sahuaro, packed my bags and I never spent a night at ASU in any place other than the Sigma Nu house.

Mike was the first of many EC's that I was proud to know at Sigma Nu. The list included Barry Shepherd, ZY 264, John Phelps, ZY 285, Ron Mays, ZY 299 and Bob Mitchell, ZY286. John, Ron, Bob and I were all from the same pledge class. I call this the pledge class of EC's and am not sure if other pledge classes were led by as many from the same class.

Each EC before me, had their own style of leadership and service to Zeta Upsilon. I had the luck to learn from all of them and this served me well in my career after graduating from ASU. Barry has passed away, but I still look up to all of them for guidance. It was because of my experiences at ZY, that I was proud to serve as President of the House Corporation that resulted in the current Zeta Upsilon house. The current members are carrying on a great tradition at ASU and I am proud of all of them.

One of the luckiest days of my life was my random

decision to stay at that Holiday Inn on my first day in Tempe.”

Andrew Hoiby

(ZY 1497) Eminent Commander 2019-2020.

“I was proud to serve as Eminent Commander for the chapter in 2019-2020. It is definitively my most challenging, rewarding, and memorable experience during my time at ASU. I was lucky enough to be entrusted with the leadership of the chapter during our first full year since rechartering and 2nd year living in the GLV. During this time we regrew the chapter to over 100 young men and brought home the first rock chapter since the 90s. I look back on the lessons learned as EC still within my professional career and will always cherish what we did that year to build a strong, sustainable chapter that is now viewed as a clear leader within not just ASU, but all fraternities nationally. Most importantly, the bond between the brothers in the chapter at the time remains strong as we continue our journeys in life.”

Ron Mays

(ZY 299) Eminent Commander 1971-1972.

“I want to relate my most memorable experience at Sigma Nu and what it taught me about leadership

and brotherhood. Those of you who were at 601 Alpha Dr. in 1970-71 will remember this well.

John Phelps, ZY285, was the Commander in the Spring of 1970. John was an excellent leader and a big thinker. He came up with the idea to build a pool in order to enhance the property and give Sigma Nu an advantage over the other fraternities on Alpha Dr. At that time the cost to build the pool was about \$2,000 (remember this is 1970) and we didn't have enough in the treasury to cover that. So in order to reduce the cost we decided to do the demolition ourselves which involved removing all of the concrete in the courtyard ourselves. We decided to do this the weekend before finals (smart, right?) on a blazing hot day in May. We started on a Saturday morning at dawn with picks, shovels, wheelbarrows, jackhammers, sledgehammers, a dump truck and a backhoe that no one really knew how to operate. By noon we had removed about 2 or 3 square yards of concrete and we realized we had taken on a project that we would not be able to complete in two days. But instead of giving up John kept motivating the brothers to continue toward our goal. As luck

would have it, there was a Zeta Upsilon Alumni (Ron Collett) who was doing his National Guard weekend in Tempe that day. He just happened to drive by 601 Alpha Dr. and could see that something was going on. He stopped in and quickly discerned that none of us knew what we were doing, but he on the other hand was a backhoe EXPERT! So, he went over to the National Guard Armory and got his Weekend Warrior pals to bring over some of their National Guard construction equipment. Those guys, some of whom were Vietnam Vets, tore into the project and had all of the concrete removed in about 4 or 5 hours. It was unbelievable!

On Monday, when the University caught wind of what we were doing they had no choice but to get involved. We agreed to pay for the pool construction and they agreed to manage the project so that it would be "built properly according to ASU standards". When we all left for home at the end of the semester there was nothing but dirt and rocks in the courtyard. John Phelps, being the leader he was, stayed in Tempe that summer to move the project along so that when we returned in August the pool project had been completed. And yes, it did

accomplish the objective of giving Sigma Nu a significant advantage, especially during rush. It was from that experience that I got my first lesson in leadership, the value of brotherhood to work together toward a common goal and how to overcome obstacles.

The next semester I was elected Commander in the Spring of my Sophomore year. I was pretty green but John Phelps and our Division Commander, John Thoren, continued to mentor me in leadership. I carry with me those lessons learned even today.

As time went on, other Commanders continued to build upon the product of John's brilliant leadership. I don't know which Commander came up with the idea of the fabled Sigma Nu Relays but it was a stroke of genius.

So my message to the current Zeta Upsilon leadership is to be aware that you have a once in a lifetime opportunity to build future leaders. Use it wisely.
